

## Buildings Upgrade Prize PCFO IGAP Prize Snapshot



## Description

The Buildings Upgrade Prize (Buildings UP) is a capacity-building prize focused on reducing greenhouse gas emissions in existing buildings through energy efficiency and efficient electrification. In Phase 1, Buildings UP will award over \$22 million in cash prizes and technical assistance.

Prize Structure and Timeline

The prize is envisioned to consist of four phases over approximately five years.



## Phase 1: Applications are due July 18, 2023

Teams may apply to one of two pathways:

- 1. <u>Equity-Centered Innovation Pathway</u>: Teams propose a new initiative or innovation to an existing initiative for delivering scalable and replicable building upgrades for "equity eligible" buildings, which include buildings in disadvantaged communities, low- and moderate-income (LMI) households, and underserved commercial, nonprofit, and public buildings.
  - Award size: \$400,000
- 2. <u>Open Innovation Pathway</u>: Teams propose a new initiative or innovation to an existing initiative that addresses a geographic area or building type and can achieve scalability and replicability of building upgrades.
  - Award size: \$200,000

DOE expects to make 20-60 awards in Phase 1. Winners of both pathways will be eligible to advance to Phase 2 and access technical assistance.

	<ul> <li>Phase 1 Application Support Prize: Submissions are due April 14</li> <li>Buildings UP is offering an application support prize to encourage new and underresourced applicants during Phase 1. Up to 50 teams will each be awarded \$5,000 (\$250,000 total) and 10 hours of technical assistance (500 hours total) to support their Concept Plan submission development in Phase 1.</li> <li>Applications are due on April 14, 2023.</li> </ul>

	Eligible Building Upgrades The minimum technologies and strategies teams must include in their initiatives include: • Efficient electric heating and cooling equipment • Weatherization and envelope improvements
	<ul> <li>Additional strategies and technologies teams may incorporate into their initiatives include:</li> <li>Efficient electric appliances</li> <li>Electric vehicle chargers</li> <li>Geothermal heating and cooling</li> <li>On-site and community solar</li> <li>Electric panel upgrades</li> <li>Building controls</li> <li>Energy storage</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Eligible Buildings</li> <li>Buildings targeted for upgrades may include one or multiple building types, such as: <ul> <li>Single family</li> <li>Multifamily</li> <li>Manufactured housing</li> <li>K–12 schools</li> <li>Higher education</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Partners Required	<ul> <li>DOE expects applications to be submitted by teams of eligible entities. All teams must include:</li> <li>A Lead Organization that commits at least one full-time equivalent (FTE) staff person for the duration of their involvement in Buildings UP. This FTE may be hired after Phase 1 awards are announced.</li> <li>A Designated Prize Recipient that is a legal entity and can receive prize funds. The Designated Prize Recipient can be a fiscal sponsor for a participating organization that is not a legal entity. The Lead Organization may also be the Designated Prize Recipient.</li> </ul>
