Description	The Buses and Bus Facilities Program provides funding for capital projects to replace, rehabilitate, purchase, or lease buses and related equipment, or to rehabilitate, purchase, construct, or lease bus-related facilities. FTA is releasing this opportunity in a combined Notice of Funding Opportunity with the Low and No Emission Grant Program.

Partnership Requirements	For applications related to zero-emission vehicles, applicants are required to submit a Zero-Emission Fleet Transition Plan. In this plan, the applicant should describe their partnership with the utility or alternative fuel provider.	
Labor Requirements	For applicants proposing any project related to zero-emission vehicles (including vehicles, facilities, equipment, etc.), 5% of the total requested funds for zero-emission project components must be used for workforce development to retrain the existing workforce and develop the workforce of the future. FTA will give priority consideration to zero-emission applicants who are able to demonstrate that they have consulted with workforce representatives on all aspects of the workforce section of the fleet transition plan; include steps to provide or connect workers to supportive services; and identify the use of at least one of the following in their plan (1) use of labor-management partnerships for training; (2) use of registered apprenticeship training to support skilling of incumbent and entry-level workers with focus on using registered apprenticeship to advance underrepresented groups.	
Tips for Being Competitive	Applicants to the Buses and Bus Facilities Program will be evaluated based on how well they describe how the proposed project will improve the safety of the transit system; improve the condition of, or otherwise modernize, the transit system; and enhance access and mobility within the service area, including improving reliability of service for riders, particularly for lowincome or underserved communities and people with disabilities.	
Examples of Prior Award Recipients	In FY2023, the Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority received \$4.5 million to rehabilitate its maintenance and administrative facility with a new heating/cooling system and roof. The project will ensure a state of good repair so the transit system can continue to provide safe and reliable transit service for residents throughout Dayton.
