Eligible Projects	 Applicants must provide an engineer or architect-approved American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) Level II energy audit less than two years old, that shows an energy savings of 15% or greater for the location where the work will occur. Eligible onsite renewable energy/grid resilient applications and projects that generate electricity from non-depletable sources of energy and/or support grid resiliency may include but are not limited to: Small-scale solar Small-scale wind Bioenergy that includes gas generation for internal use or electric generation as by-products Geothermal Microgrids Microturbines Combined Heat and Power (CHP) Battery storage and sub-components

Tips for Being Competitive	 Applications will be evaluated on five criteria: Project Information/Energy Efficiency Savings/Economic/Employment Impacts for Ohio Environmental Compliance Project Readiness/Implementation Plan/Identified Risks Project Match/Innovativeness Supporting Documentation 	
Labor Requirements	Applicants are encouraged to ensure projects use strong labor standards, including project labor agreements and community benefit agreements that offer wages at or above the prevailing rate. Local hiring is also strongly encouraged. Full documentation and submission of hiring and labor payment records will be required for awardees.
