		<u>Max Award:</u> Planning and Demonstration Grants (\$10 million); Implementation Grants (\$25 million)
Description	Created under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program aims to improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through safety action plan development and refinement and implementation focused on all users.	
Eligible Recipients	<ul> <li>A metropolitan planning organization (MPO)</li> <li>A political subdivision of a State or territory <ul> <li>This includes cities, towns, counties, special districts, and similar units of local government. A transit district, authority, or public benefit corporation is eligible if it was created under State law.</li> <li>A federally recognized Tribal government</li> <li>A multi-jurisdictional group of eligible entities</li> </ul> </li> <li>An eligible applicant for an Implementation Grant must also meet <u>at least one</u> of these conditions: <ul> <li>Have ownership and/or maintenance responsibilities over a roadway network</li> <li>Have safety responsibilities that affect roadways</li> <li>Have an agreement from the agency that has ownership and/or maintenance responsibilities for the roadway within the applicant's jurisdiction.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul> <li><u>Planning and Demonstration Grants</u></li> <li>Planning and Demonstration Grants have three different types of activities:</li> <li>Develop an Action Plan</li> <li>Conduct supplemental safety planning to enhance an Action Plan</li> <li>Carry out demonstration activities to inform the development of, or an update to, an Action Plan.</li> </ul>		
	The three different types of activities under Planning and Demonstration Grants can either be bundled together into one application, or an applicant may choose to request funding for only one of the activities.		
	Implementation Grants Implementation Grants fund projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan that address roadway safety problems. Implementation Grants may also fund supplemental planning and demonstration activities, as well as planning, design, and development activities for projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan. Applicants must have an existing Action Plan or have an existing plan that is substantially similar and meets the eligibility requirements of an Action Plan to apply for Implementation Grants.

Tips for Being Competitive	<ul> <li>DOT has outlined specific priorities for the SS4A grant program that are reflected in the selection criteria:</li> <li>Promote safety to prevent death and serious injuries on public roadways</li> <li>Employ low-cost, high-impact strategies that can improve safety over a wide geographic area</li> <li>Ensure equitable investment in the safety needs of underserved communities, which includes both underserved urban and rural communities</li> <li>Incorporate evidence-based projects and strategies and adopt innovative technologies and strategies</li> <li>Demonstrate engagement with a variety of public and private stakeholders</li> <li>Align with the Department's mission and Strategic Goals such as safety; climate change and sustainability; equity and Justice40; and workforce development, job quality, and wealth creation</li> </ul>		
Labor Requirements	<ul> <li>Under Selection Criterion #4, DOT has established the following workforce goals:</li> <li>For skilled construction labor needed on the project, incorporate strong labor standards</li> <li>For non-construction work on the project, commit to supporting training opportunities as part of the project, with a description of how training and job opportunities on the project will lead into registered apprenticeship or good-paying jobs</li> </ul>
